The political and institutional framework in Africa

- The Human Rights to Drinking Water and Sanitation
- The key African commitments for prioritizing and supporting the sanitation efforts of RMCs are:
- √ The eThekwini Commitments on Sanitation (2008)
- ✓ AfricaSan: Transforming Sanitation in Africa whose 3rd edition in 2015 led to the adoption of the NGOR Declaration on Sanitation and Hygiene
- ✓ The Addis Ababa Agenda for Action (AAAA) as a global post-2015 development funding framework





AfDB's Response: calls for Partnerships

- 1. The Bank's 10 years Strategy 2013-2022 & the Five Goals - "High 5's
- 2. The New Policy on Water: Water Security and Sanitation
- 3. The Bank's Water and Sanitation operations
- 4. The Africa Urban Sanitation Investment Fund (AUSIF)







Prospects for the Bank's Support



- Provide high level support for Sanitation and Hygiene
- Support RMCs in the implementation of the NGOR Commitments
- Build strategic alliance with AMCOW
- Partner with governments, private sector and other stakeholders to drive sanitation and hygiene access for the poorest
- Develop and document innovative sanitation and hygiene products and services
- Coordinate through a continental private sector
 network for sanitation in the continent
